During the tour to Boudhanath, the sound of chanting monks, the smell of incense, and prayer wheels make you feel tranquility. The surroundings of the Stupa are accessible by a Wheelchair. You can also take part in a circumambulation of the Stupa.

After a pleasant visit to Kathmandu's three prominent heritage sites, we'll drop you off at your hotel. You'll have dinner and an overnight stay at the Kathmandu Hotel.

## Accommodations

However, the Nepal-accessible wheelchair tour doesn't take you to higher elevations; the temperature will not be freezing at lower elevations. Thus, Winter is also a good choice for the tour.
