This peaceful and calm place offers a break for visitors. You can do meditation, study Buddhist philosophy, or experience a monastic life for a day or more.

Besides the monastery area is the Vajrayogini temple, which is famous for being used by Newar

Buddhists. You can also visit the Yanglesho cave, a small retreat near the Monastery. Pharping Monastery is a renowned institution for young monks who want to live a monastic life.

Day 03: 3) Namobuddha and Kapan Monastery Exploration

About 40 kilometers drive eastward via Araniko Highway takes you to Dhulikhel. B.P. highway diverges from Dhulikhel headed southbound.

After 20 kilometers from Dhulikhel via B.P highway and you reach the tranquil monument of Namobuddha. Also known as Namura Hill, a huge monastery has been built atop the hill. This place is a sacred site for Buddhists owing to its religious history.

Reincarnation of Gautam Buddha, Mahasattva is believed to have sacrificed himself to feed tiger cubs at this location. The space resembles typical Buddhist heritage with a silent ambiance and architecturally magnificent Gumpa sitting at the top of a hill.

Many monks reside in the nearby Vihars and offer their prayer at this Gumba. We return to Kathmandu after lunch and then head toward the next destination, Kapan monastery.

Another prominent Buddhist revered site is the Kapan Monastery. It is located about 15 kilometers from downtown Kathmandu.

This site is popularised for its spiritual retreats and school for Tibetan Buddhism. Kapan monastery follows the teaching of the Gelug tradition, similar to one taught by the Dalai Lama.

This monastery is located in the Kapan area on top of a hill overlooking the Shivapuri forest to its north.

As with any other monastery, this Gumba is beautifully built with intricate carvings. Also, Shiny golden color and Tibetan architecture. We stay at the monastery for the early evening prayer procession and return to our hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 04: 4) Fly to Lumbini and Explore

Your guide will wake you up early in the morning for your flight to Lumbini. We drive to Tribhuvan International Airport, the domestic terminal, and board the flight toward Lumbini.

As you take off from Kathmandu, you will have a wide-angled gaze at the capital city. The Himalayan Mountains shimmer with white snow to your right.

We head westbound from Kathmandu and fly for another 30 minutes to land at Gautam Buddha International Airport, Bhairahawa.

Bhairahawa is a city that borders India to its south. We take a vehicle and head towards our hotel in Lumbini.

After you lunch at the hotel, we begin our sightseeing of Lumbini. Lumbini is a religious site for Buddhists, as Siddhartha Gautam (Gautam Buddha) was born here.

Mayadevi temple stands in the middle of the Lumbini site, marking the evidence of the exact point of his birth. A small pond resides near this temple. The excavated remains of the ancient palace of Kapilvastu are still visible today.

The area provides a serene and quaint ambiance. The Lumbini site beholds several monasteries built by various Buddhist nations: Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand, China, and others.

There are other points of attractions located within the site, like a water pond, a white peace pagoda, and a natural fire that has been burning for ages. We returned back to our hotel for a warm evening.

Day 05: 5) Explore at Tilaurakot and Overnight

After your breakfast at the hotel, we unfold another significant Buddhist site located 20 kilometers west of Lumbini. Tilaurakot is believed to be the palace of Siddhartha Gautam.

This site is located beside the local town of Taulihawa, Which is believed to be the maternal palace of Gautam Buddha. The remains in the area suggest the palace had been erected before 500 BCE.

There are lots of excavation works underway at Tilaurakot. It is the capital city of the Sakya dynasty. Siddhartha Gautam stayed in Tilaurakot palace before sacrificing his materialistic life and becoming Buddha as we know it today.

There are ancient ruins and various modern-day Buddhist monuments built on and around this site.

We will return back to Lumbini after the guided tour of Tilaurakot. You have the rest of the day leisure to wander on your own. We stayed at the hotel in Lumbini for the night.

Day 06: Drive to Pokhara, overnight

our days in Lumbini end with the beginning of a scenic drive toward the bustling city of Pokhara.

From Lumbini, we first merge with Siddhartha Highway at Bhairahawa. We take the road heading northbound, traversing via the dense town of Butwal.

From here, we reach the crossroad with the eastern road headed for Chitwan and the northern road headed towards Pokhara. Siddhartha Highway is a narrow roadway with numerous hairpin bends all along. It covers a total distance of 180 kilometers, ending at Pokhara.

After 2 hours of riding, we reached the newar town of Palpa. We move further, going through the Syangja district via its headquarters, Waling. The road, while small, is still scenic, traversing via high hills located in and around.

After 4 hours of drive from Palpa, we reach Pokhara.

Panoramic vistas of the Annapurna Mountains welcome us as we step into Pokhara. We will be escorted to our hotel in Lakeside, [Pokhara](#), for the night.

Day 07: 7) Explore at Pokhara and overnight

Pokhara is stationed in the lap of gigantic Annapurna massifs. If the weather is clear enough, you will have an alluring gaze at these towering massifs from your hotel room itself.

Pokhara has a humid weather for the most of the year. The Phewa Lake, located in the city's outskirts, provides a natural ambiance in Pokhara.

We start by visiting the famous Peace Pagoda stupa located above the hill right next to Phewa Lake. This stupa stands as a symbol of tranquility, unity, and global peace.

It resembles the white stupa you have earlier seen in Lumbini. There is a huge garden in the yard of this stupa. 4 statues of Buddha are embedded in the stupa, which sits meditating in all directions.

The serene view seen from this stupa will take your breath away. You will have panoramic views of Annapurna massifs consisting of Machapuchare (Fishtail) (6,993 m), Annapurna I (8,091m), Annapurna II (7,937m), Annapurna III: Altitude - (7,555 m) and Annapurna IV (7,525 m).

We descend to Pokhara City from the Peace Pagoda and head for Matepani Gumba. Matepani Gumba is located on the outskirts of Pokhara.

It's at most 10 minutes drive from Phewa Lake to reach this Gumba. This Tibetan Buddhist monastery is known for its intricate architecture, colorful prayer flags, and peaceful surroundings.

It provides a serene environment for meditation and reflection. We returned back to our hotel in the evening for our stay.

The road merges at Prithvi Chok and from there begins Prithvi Highway. We pass via numerous small highway-side towns located along the road. We enter Tanahun district and reach Mugling after 3 hours of driving.

we follow along the Trishuli River headed eastward From Mugling. The road takes up the river basin space and is full of curvy bends. Our vehicle will drop us off at Kathmandu. Overnight at a hotel in Kathmandu.

1. Swayambhunath, Buddhist tour

Swayambhunath, to the west of Kathmandu Valley, is an ancient religious site on the top of a hill. It's also known as 'Monkey Temple,' foretold in many mythological stories. It is a sacred Buddhist temple but is also popular among Hindus.

Swayambhunath stupa has giant eyes and eyebrows that have symbolic meanings. The word 'Swayambhu' means self-created. The parts of the stupa have different purposes. The dome signifies the whole world. The eyes represent wisdom and compassion, and the curled nose symbolizes unity. History says a ruler inside Kathmandu Valley found it around the Lichhavi period. Even Emperor Ashoka built a monument to it later.

2. Boudhanath

Boudhanath is a big white dome between a giant Mandala with a big pair of huge eyes that symbolize a beacon of peace. Many tourists come just for a visit or as a pilgrim to this 14th-century-built Buddhist stupa.

This spectacular Buddhist site became the pilgrimage center for many centuries and is still notable. People gather here to see the grand view of the site. They offer peace and prayers through lights, butter candles, chants, etc. The prayer flags, wheels, and monks will give you spiritual vibes. You will observe the serenity in the aura and air of this place.

3. Namu Buddha

Namu Buddha is on the outskirts of the valley, particularly to the southeast of a valley surrounded by the Tamang community. It would be best to drive for a few hours to get there.

At an elevation of around 1750m, it is perfect for a short hike, meditation, and watching the beautiful

sunrise and sunset. Along with the magnificent view of the mountain peak, this Buddhist site is an important pilgrimage site.

Legend says that the Namo Buddha stupa was built on the bones of the Prince, who offered himself to a hungry tigress to save her and her cubs. The vital lesson for any individual on the learning path is to overcome compassion and help without hesitation. The same thing happened to the Prince; hence, this Monastery is prominent for all Buddhist followers.

4. Kapan Monastery

Kapan monastery on the outskirts of Kathmandu Valley is well-known for preaching Buddhism to practitioners. You can visit the Monastery and take a look around every Saturday. Otherwise, it doesn't allow the public to enter on other days of the week.

This Monastery accommodates around 400 monks and teaches them to get a monastic life. It's an excellent place to learn more about Buddhism and its philosophy, as you can interact with monks and use their library.

5. Pharping Monastery

On the southern outskirts of the Kathmandu valley, there is a sacred site for Buddhists, Pharping Monastery. Around 200 monks reside and study Buddhism in this Monastery.

This peaceful and calm place offers visitors a break. You can meditate, study Buddhist philosophy, or experience a monastic life for a day or more. A small hotel near the Monastery runs the Monastery and helps with its expenses.

Besides the monastery area is the Vajrayogini temple, famous for being used by Newar Buddhists. You can also visit the Yanglesho cave, a small retreat near the Monastery. Pharping Monastery is a renowned institution for young monks who want to live a monastic life.

Buddhist Monestry in Pokhara.

1. Matepani Gumba

Legend says that the Tibetan king, who used a sacred sword to slay demons, lost his sword in Matepani, Pokhara. Since then, it has been a holy and auspicious place.

The Monastery has beautiful architecture and marvelous art on the wall. Though it has its own mythological story, people only found the Monastery in 1960 AD.

Monks perform daily and special rituals at the end of the day. You might observe the rare tradition if you have a friend there. Walking up to the gumba, you will see the spectacular view of Mount Machhapuchhre and the serene environment.

2. World Peace Stupa

World Peace Stupa is one of the significant tourist attractions in Pokhara. It is one of eight peace stupas built by a monk of Nipponzan-Myohoji. Four statues from different places signify different yet sacred meanings: special pujas and daily Buddhist rituals are held in the Dhamma hall near the peace statue.

You will find majestic [Annapurna Himalayas](#) and lake views from Pokhara. Pokhara City is also famous for hiking and cycling trails for tourists. You can enjoy the religiously significant peaceful place with a splendid panoramic view in Pokhara, Nepal.

3. Hyangja Tibetan Refugee Camp

Hyangja is on the outskirts of Pokhara Valley. You can take a vehicle to this small village or hike it.

This village consists of Tibetan refugees who fled China during the Cultural Revolution. They live here, and they practice their Buddhist rituals in the monasteries. They are still keeping their language, culture, and traditions alive.

If you made it to the camp, you could explore the areas and monasteries with someone who knows the site better. You can interact with them and learn more about their Buddhist cultures and language.

You may buy some handmade and eccentric souvenirs from them. They sell handmade bracelets, necklaces, rings, woodcarvings, carpets and rugs, and clothing. They also sell authentic thangka paintings.

The Birthplace of Lord Buddha is LUMBINI.

1. Maya Devi Temple, Nepal Buddhist tour

Maya Devi temple is the main temple around the site of the birthplace of Lord Buddha.

It has a sacred garden and a sacred pool. Archaeologists have found the first evidence of Buddha's life here. So many archaeologists have invested their time and effort in discovering many facts and artifacts of ancient times.

Emperor Ashoka built the temple when he visited it around the third century. This ancient temple is of the utmost importance, being the birthplace of Gautam Buddha. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

2. Ashoka Pillar

Emperor Ashoka built the Ashoka pillar while he was in Lumbini to pay homage to the birthplace of Buddha. After losing his life in the Kalinga War, Ashoka devoted his later life to Buddhism. He built several Ashoka pillars in India and Nepal.

The Ashoka Pillar in Nepal is half-broken and capped to protect it from breaking down. The construction of this pillar was to honor the Emperor's visit to Lord Buddha's birthplace. You may find it fascinating because the Emperor visited the place around the 3rd century.

And this pillar still stands here even though it's half broken in present status. You will find more facts about it once you visit and read the inscriptions on the stone.

3. World Peace Stupa, Lumbini, Nepal

Two peace stupas were built in Nepal, one in Pokhara and another in Lumbini. The architecture and design of the stupas are the same, signifying the world piece. The white dome looks fascinating from far and near as well.

The Japanese built it on the premises of the birthplace of Lord Buddha. Like the World Peace Stupa of

Pokhara, it has four statues of different Buddhas brought from other countries.

4. Tilaurakot in Lumbini

Tilaurakot is on the outskirts of Lumbini. It traces the ancient royal family in which Gautam Buddha was born and spent his first 29 years as a prince in this old location.

There are remnants of the palace, which you will see while visiting it. After much research, archaeologists have found palaces, temples, monuments, sculptures, ponds, etc. They have also displayed many artifacts in the museum.

Buddhism started in Nepal.
